Project Description Summary

*PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The project would include removal of existing structures, site cleanup and development of up to 165 senior housing units, up to 110 single-family residences and a 1-acre park on the project site.



Santa Clara Gardens Project Environmental Scoping Meeting October 3, 2005

Project Description (continued)-

- *SENIOR HOUSING COMPONENT:
- -Development of 6 acres
- -Up to 165 affordable senior housing units in 2 buildings
- -Up to four stories in height
- -Typically 1-bdrm units w/ two 2-bdrm mgrs unit.
- -Up to 165 parking spaces
- -Associated site improvements w/ approx. 3-acres of gardens



Santa Clara Gardens Project Environmental Scoping Meeting October 3, 2005

Project Description (Continued)-

SINGLE FAMILY COMPONENT:

- -Development of 10 acres
- -Up to 110 single-family dwelling units
- -Two-story units
- -Typically 3-4 bdrm units
- -220 attached garages spaces & 50 on-street spaces
- -Associated site improvements including Private Streets

■PARK COMPONENT:

- -Development of 1-acre City Park
- -Site Improvement per City Standards
